- The playlist name, status, and complete list of items in the playlist are display on

right.

- The bottom half of the screen shows the name, creator, when the item was last updated, along with the number of views, likes, plays, and comments, and a field to enter a new comment. Tabs are displayed based on the media's settings.
- Media related to the media being played is shown as well.
