## Access the language settings


- 1. Access My Media.

The edit page displays.







Notice the **Set default language** check box is <u>deactivated</u> for the first language you enter because the first language entered is always used as the default. When adding subsequent languages, this check box is active, allowing you to adjust the default used.

#### 3. Click Save.

The language is now set for the metadata.




## Edit a language
