

Guest links vs. Invite links in Moodle – what’s the difference?

About

Kaltura provides two ways to give access to media: **guest links** and **invite links**. Media can include videos, documents, quizzes, live events, and Kaltura Room sessions.

While these options may sound similar, they’re designed for different use cases.

Guest links (for broad access)

Use a guest link when you want to **open access to a wider audience**.

You create a single link and share it however you like, via email, chat, or even social media. Anyone with the link can join by entering a name and email (no account needed).

Guests can easily access the content, but have limited capabilities once inside.

This is a good fit when:

- You’re sharing with a large or unknown group
- You want a quick, frictionless way for people to access the content
- You don’t need to control individual permissions



Think of it as: “Here’s the link - anyone can use it.”

Invite links – controlled access for specific people

Use invite links when you need to **invite specific people and control their access or permissions**.

Each link is tied to a particular email address, so only that person can use it. Depending on the content type, you can also control what they’re allowed to do, whether that’s viewing media, collaborating, or participating in a live session as a moderator or speaker.

This is useful when:

- You're inviting specific viewers, speakers, moderators, or contributors
- You want to control access and permissions
- You need to know exactly who's invited

✓ Think of it as: "You control who can access the content and what they can do."

Access the features

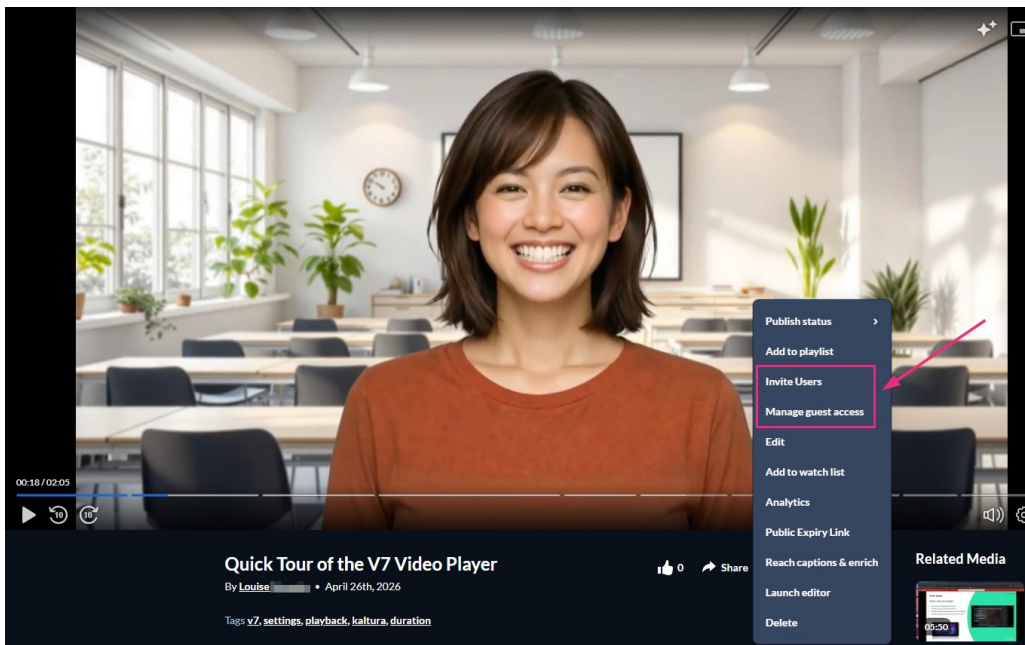
You can access guest links and invite links from media pages, [Kaltura Rooms](#), [channel room](#) sessions, and [media gallery](#) room sessions.

Depending on the media type, these options may be available from the **media page** or from the **Participants tab** during a live session.

From the media page

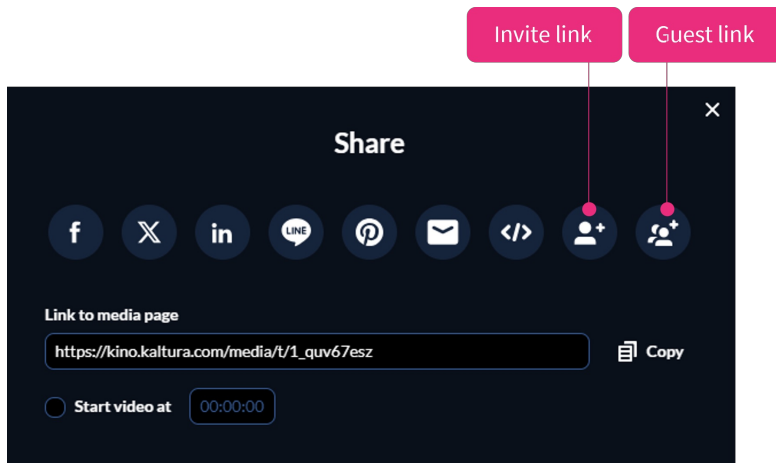
Three-dot menu

Click the **three dots** below the player and select **Invite users** or **Manage guest access**.



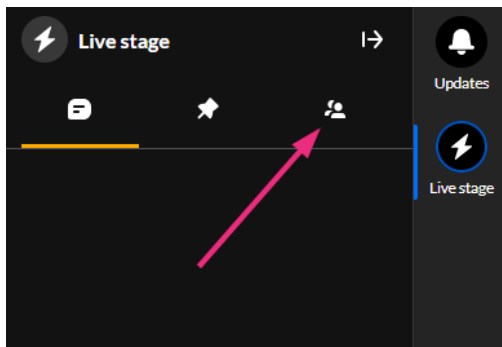
Share button

Click **Share** below the player, then select the relevant option.

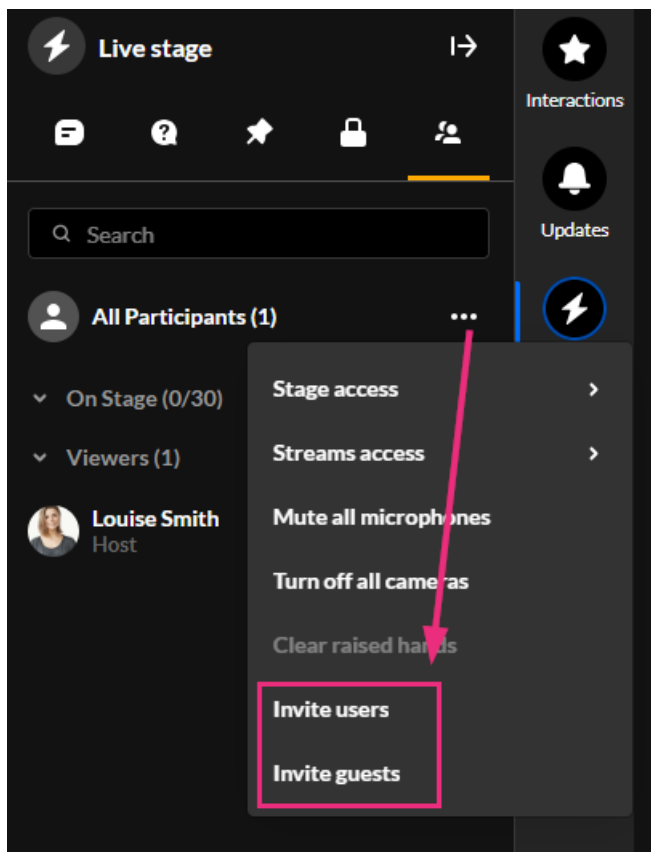


From the Participants tab (for live sessions)

1. Navigate to the **Participants** tab.



2. Click the **three dots** to the right of 'All participants' and select **Invite users** or **Invite guests**.
